





If you encounter blue butterflies in any sizeable number on heathland, they are likely to be silverstudded blues.


However, if you are able to get a closer look, there are some key differences to look out for that can clinch a definitive ID.
















Silver-Studded Blue

Silver-studded blues fly weakly and usually do not fly more than a few centimetres above the ground – often turning round if they encounter an obstruction.
